

What Do Clean and Sober Houses Offer?

SHIP Houses offer a supportive way of living and opportunities to learn skills in a clean and sober environment.

- Residents receive 24-hour support from peers in recovery and on-site resident managers. SHIP staff provide 24/7 oversight through an emergency phone number.
- Learn alcohol and drug-free living skills. Learn life skills that one may have lost to addiction or never developed previously.
- SHIP staff are assigned to each house and provide guidance and oversight at weekly house meetings. Random drug testing is also required.
- Not going back to where a recovering addict came from may be one of the single most important reasons for SHIP Clean and Sober Houses. Using this cost-effective way to improve the chances of recovery from alcoholism and drug addiction may be the best way to show the community that recovery works, and that recovering addicts can become productive citizens.

Individuals may live in SHIP Clean and Sober House as long as they want, as long as they remain clean and sober and pay their rent. Our vision is to help people transition to a self-sustainable lifestyle with a strong support network and to contribute back to their community.

Eligibility For Membership

Individuals can apply to live in a Clean and Sober House if they have met one of the following criteria:

- Completed inpatient treatment
- Completed a detoxification program
- Have a minimum of 30 days of sobriety

Other Guidelines

- Each individual must be willing to accept SHIP programming and house rules
- Each individual must be able to pay his/her rent or qualify for housing assistance through BPA, VA or have third party verification of homelessness.
- Each individual must have the desire to work on his/her recovery while working towards self-sufficiency.
- There are separate houses for men, women, and women with children.

Cost of Living in a Clean and Sober House

- Effective March 1, 2008, the first month's rent and move-in fees are \$500. Each subsequent month is \$400. Rent is due and payable on the first day of each month. Rent includes rent, utilities, and free laundry facilities. SHIP also has a job readiness program for persons who are unemployed, case management for eligible persons and a food bank for persons needing food assistance.
- Exclusions: We are sorry, but we are not able to serve sex offenders, arsonists, or persons who have been convicted of any crime relating to the distribution or manufacturing of controlled substances
